



Light Hiring Competition Over a Thin Supply of Regional Talent




Supply (Jobs)

Delaware is not a hotspot for this kind of talent. The national average for an area this size is 42,240* employees, while there are 29,063 here.



Earnings Per Job

Earnings per job are above the national average. The national average salary for Manufacturing in an area this size is \$97,692, while in Delaware it is \$109,266. Earnings per jobs is the total industry earnings divided by the number of jobs in the industry.



Demand (Job Postings)


Competition from online job postings is low in Delaware. The national average for an area this size is 603* job postings/mo, while there are 541 here.

Supply (Jobs)


Supply Is Lower Than the National Average



Retirement Risk Is About Average, While Overall Diversity Is High




Retiring Soon

Racial diversity is high in Delaware. The national average for an area this size is 10,407* racially diverse employees, while there are 13,086 here.




Gender Diversity


Unemployment Rate Trends

Unemployment shown at the 2-digit sector level.




Industry Age Breakdown



Industry Race/Ethnicity Breakdown






